1. INTRODUCTION

3. POSITIVE ACTIONS

At the Radcliffe Manor, we will:

Waste Management and Safe Disposal

- Print only what is necessary and double-sided wherever possible.
- Maintain a robust recycling system, ensuring separation of recyclable and non-recyclable waste and preventing contamination.
- Reduce single-use plastics and encourage the use of sustainable alternatives.
- Maintain and encourage the use of recycling bins for paper, plastic and other waste materials.
- Ensure waste metals, including redundant mobility aids and electrical and electronic equipment, is collected, safely stored and disposed of/re-cycled in accordance with relevant directives.
- Minimise kitchen waste and ensure the correct disposal of used cooking products.
- Compost organic waste where feasible, including waste collected from the kitchen to transform into compost for use in our gardens.
- Partner with suppliers who prioritise eco-friendly packaging and minimal waste.

Energy Efficiency

- Use energy-efficient appliances and lighting throughout the Home.
- Encourage staff and residents to turn off unused lights and devices, where this does not pose a risk to health and wellbeing.
- Regularly monitor energy consumption and identify areas for improvement.
- Explore alternative renewable energy options such as solar thermal systems, biomass boilers and local sustainable energy networks which can optimise power use.

Water Conservation

- Install water-efficient fixtures and appliances.
- Raise awareness of responsible water usage among staff and residents.
- Promptly repair leaks and reduce unnecessary water use.

Sustainable Procurement

- Prioritise suppliers that follow ethical and sustainable practices.
- Source food from local providers, where possible.
- Reduce reliance on non-recyclable packaging.

Green Space and Biodiversity

- Maintain our extensive gardens and green areas to enhance the well-being of our residents.
- Aim to plant native and pollinator-friendly plants and shrubs.
- Use vegetables grown in our raised beds to supplement and enhance our home-cooked meals.
- Maintain our outdoor spaces that encourage our residents to enjoy the outdoors in a safe and comfortable way, such as the Courtyard, the Pavillion and the Summer House.

Staff and Resident Engagement

- Ensure that staff and residents are informed and kept up to date with our sustainability practices.
- Ensure staff receive regular training focused on recognising the signs of climate-induced stress or health decline in residents, and respond according to established protocols.
- Implement initiatives to involve residents in eco-friendly activities.
- Encourage feedback and suggestions to improve sustainability efforts.
